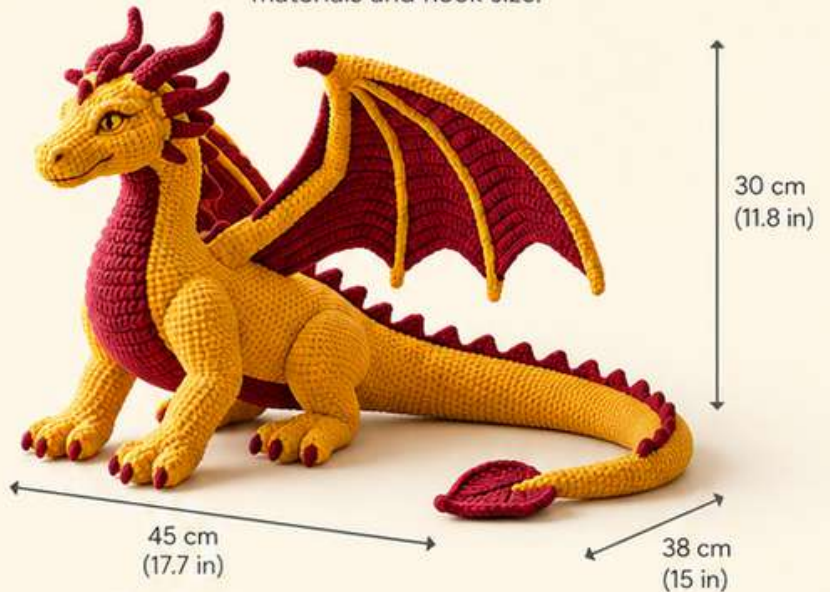

COMPLETE STITCH GUIDE

FOR BEGINNERS

Step-by-step photo guide to the basic stitches and techniques used in this dragon pattern.

1 MAGIC RING (MR)



1. Wrap yarn around your fingers as shown.
2. Insert hook under the first strand, yarn over.
3. Pull through and chain 1 to secure the ring.
4. Work stitches into the ring. Pull tail to close.

2 CHAIN (ch)



1. Yarn over.
2. Pull yarn through the loop on the hook.
3. One chain stitch is complete.
4. Repeat for the number of chains needed.

3 SLIP STITCH (sl st)



1. Insert hook into the stitch.
2. Yarn over.
3. Pull yarn through stitch and the loop on hook.
4. Slip stitch complete.

4 SINGLE CROCHET (sc)



1. Insert hook into the stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over again.
4. Pull through both loops on the hook.

5 HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)



1. Yarn over, insert hook into stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over again.
4. Pull through all three loops on hook.

6 DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)



1. Yarn over, insert hook into stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over, pull through two loops.
4. Yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.

7 TREBLE CROCHET (tr)



1. Yarn over twice, insert hook into stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over, pull through two loops.
4. Yarn over, pull through two loops.
5. Yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.

8 INCREASE (inc)



Work two (or more) stitches in the same stitch. This increases the stitch count.

9 INVISIBLE DECREASE (inv dec)



1. Insert hook into front loop only of next stitch.
2. Insert hook into front loop only of next stitch.
3. Yarn over, pull through both front loops.
4. Stitch decreased.

10 WORKING IN ROUNDS



Work in a spiral without joining at the end of each round. Use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each round.

11 COLOR CHANGING



1. Work until the last step of the stitch.
2. Yarn over with new color.
3. Pull through remaining loops.
4. Continue with new color.

12 FASTEN OFF



1. Cut yarn, leaving a tail.
2. Pull the tail through the loop on hook.
3. Pull tight to secure and weave in ends.

TIPS FOR BEST RESULTS

- ✓ Keep your tension consistent.
- ✓ Use the right hook size for your yarn.
- ✓ Count your stitches at the end of each round.
- ✓ Use stitch markers to avoid losing your place.
- ✓ Practice these stitches before starting the pattern.



EXTRA TECHNIQUES

- **FLO – Front Loop Only**
Work into the front loop only of the stitch.
- **BLO – Back Loop Only**
Work into the back loop only of the stitch.
- **FO – Fasten Off**
Finish the piece and secure the yarn.

MATERIALS & TOOLS

Everything you need to crochet your dragon.

YARN



DK / Light Worsted Weight Yarn
(100% Cotton or Acrylic)
Recommended: 8PLY / DK



Mustard Yellow – Main Color
(Body, head, legs, tail, wing edges)
Approx. 350–400 g



Deep Red / Burgundy – Accent Color
(Belly, wings, spikes, horns, claws, tail tip)
Approx. 250–300 g



Black – Eye Detail
Small amount



Gold / Amber – Eye Color (optional)
Small amount



TOOLS & NOTIONS

- 2.5 mm Crochet Hook (or size needed to obtain gauge)
- Yarn Needle (Tapestry Needle)
- Stitch Markers
- Scissors
- Fiberfill Stuffing
- 28–30 Gauge Floral / Craft Wire (for wings, tail and shaping)
- Green Floral Tape
- Hot Glue Gun (optional, for extra hold)
- Pins (for positioning while assembling)
- Row Counter (optional)
- Needle Nose Pliers (to bend wire)
- Small Piece of Felt or White Fabric (for eye backing)



ABOUT THE MATERIALS

Using the recommended materials will help you achieve the best shape, structure and durability for your dragon. Cotton yarn is ideal for a firm texture and to hold the details beautifully, but acrylic yarn also works well.

HOOK SIZE NOTE



A 2.5 mm hook is recommended. If you crochet tightly, you may use a 2.75 mm hook. Adjust as needed to maintain your gauge.

MATERIAL QUANTITY GUIDE

COLOR	USE	APPROX. AMOUNT
Mustard Yellow	Body, head, legs, tail, wing edges	350–400 g
Deep Red / Burgundy	Belly, wings, spikes, horns, claws, tail tip	250–300 g
Black	Eye detail	Small amount
Gold / Amber	Eye color (optional)	Small amount

TIPS

- ✓ Stuff firmly but not too tight.
- ✓ Use stitch markers to keep your rounds even.
- ✓ Wire will help the wings and tail hold their shape.
- ✓ Take your time and enjoy the process!

YARN COLOR GUIDE

Use this guide to obtain the same look as the sample dragon.

COLOR GUIDE



MUSTARD YELLOW

Main Color

Used for the body, head, legs, tail, and wing edges.



DEEP RED / BURGUNDY

Accent Color

Used for the belly, wing membranes, horns, spikes, claws, and tail tip.



BLACK

Eye Detail

Used for the pupils and small facial details.



GOLD / AMBER (OPTIONAL)

Eye Color (Optional)

Used for the iris to give the eyes more depth.



NOTE

The colors shown above were used in the sample dragon. Slight variations may occur depending on yarn brand and lighting.

TIPS FOR COLOR CHOICES

- Lighter main colors give a soft and friendly look.
- Darker accent colors create bold details and depth.
- Contrasting wing and belly colors highlight the dragon's shape.
- Eye color can be customized to match your creative vision!

YARN RECOMMENDATIONS

Use DK / Light Worsted weight cotton or acrylic yarn for the best stitch definition and durability. Cotton yarn provides a smooth texture, while acrylic yarn offers softness and vibrant colors.



ABBREVIATIONS

These standard crochet abbreviations are used throughout this pattern.
All terms are written in US crochet terminology.

ABBREVIATION	FULL TERM	DESCRIPTION
MR	Magic Ring	Create an adjustable ring to begin working in the round.
ch	Chain	Yarn over and pull through the loop on the hook.
sl st	Slip Stitch	Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both loops on hook.
sc	Single Crochet	Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops.
hdc	Half Double Crochet	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all loops.
dc	Double Crochet	Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over, pull through two loops.
tr	Treble Crochet	Yarn over twice, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over, pull through two loops.
dtr	Double Treble Crochet	Yarn over three times, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops 4 times.
inc	Increase	Work two stitches in the same stitch.
dec	Decrease	Work two stitches together into one stitch.
inv dec	Invisible Decrease	Decrease worked in the front loops only for a cleaner look.
FLO	Front Loop Only	Work into the front loop only of the stitch.
BLO	Back Loop Only	Work into the back loop only of the stitch.
rep	Repeat	Repeat the instructions in brackets the number of times given.
()	Repeat Section	Instructions in parentheses are repeated as a group.
[]	Total Stitches	The total number of stitches you should have at the end of the round.
st / sts	Stitch / Stitches	Refers to one stitch (st) or more than one stitch (sts).
yo	Yarn Over	Wrap the yarn over the hook from back to front.
FO	Fasten Off	Secure the yarn and end off.
sk	Skip	Skip the next stitch(s) as instructed.
rnd(s)	Round(s)	A complete round of stitches when working in the round.
RS	Right Side	The side of the work facing you.
WS	Wrong Side	The opposite side of the work.

QUICK REFERENCE

- Read the pattern carefully before starting.
- Use a stitch marker to keep track of your rounds and important stitches.
- Count your stitches at the end of each round to ensure accuracy.
- The number in brackets [] at the end of each round tells you how many stitches you should have.



SPECIAL STITCH NOTES

- **Invisible Decrease (inv dec):** Insert hook into front loop of first stitch, front loop of second stitch, yarn over, pull through both loops, yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.
- **Increase (inc):** Work two stitches in the same stitch to increase.



IMPORTANT REMINDER

Abbreviations make patterns easier to read and follow.
Once you get familiar with them, you'll be able to crochet

any pattern with confidence!

Step-by-step photo guide to the basic stitches and techniques used in this dragon pattern.

1 MAGIC RING (MR)



1. Wrap yarn around your fingers as shown.
2. Insert hook under the first strand, yarn over.
3. Pull through and chain 1 to secure the ring.
4. Work stitches into the ring. Pull tail to close.

2 CHAIN (ch)



1. Yarn over.
2. Pull yarn through the loop on the hook.

3 SLIP STITCH (sl st)

3. Pull yarn through stitch and the loop on hook.

4 SINGLE CROCHET (sc)



1. Insert hook into the stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over again.
4. Pull through both loops on the hook.

5 HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)



1. Yarn over, insert hook into stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over again.
4. Pull through all three loops on hook.

6 DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)



1. Yarn over, insert hook into stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over, pull through two loops.
4. Yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.

7 TREBLE CROCHET (tr)



1. Yarn over twice, insert hook into stitch.
2. Yarn over, pull up a loop.
3. Yarn over, pull through two loops.
4. Yarn over, pull through two loops.
5. Yarn over, pull through remaining two loops.

8 INCREASE (inc)



Work two (or more) stitches in the same stitch. This increases the stitch count.

9 INVISIBLE DECREASE (inv dec)



1. Insert hook into front loop only of next stitch.
2. Insert hook into front loop only of next stitch.
3. Yarn over, pull through both front loops.
4. Stitch decreased.

10 WORKING IN ROUNDS



Work in a spiral without joining at the end of each round. Use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each round.

11 COLOR CHANGING



1. Work until the last step of the stitch.
2. Yarn over with new color.
3. Pull through remaining loops.
4. Continue with new color.

12 FASTEN OFF

HEAD – PART 1

BASIC HEAD STRUCTURE

We will start by creating the basic head shape.
This section forms the foundation for the snout, eyes, and facial details.

DETAILS

Worked in continuous rounds (spiral).
Use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each round.
Stuff firmly as you go for a nice shape.
The head is worked in Mustard Yellow.
Do not join rounds unless stated.

YARN COLOR

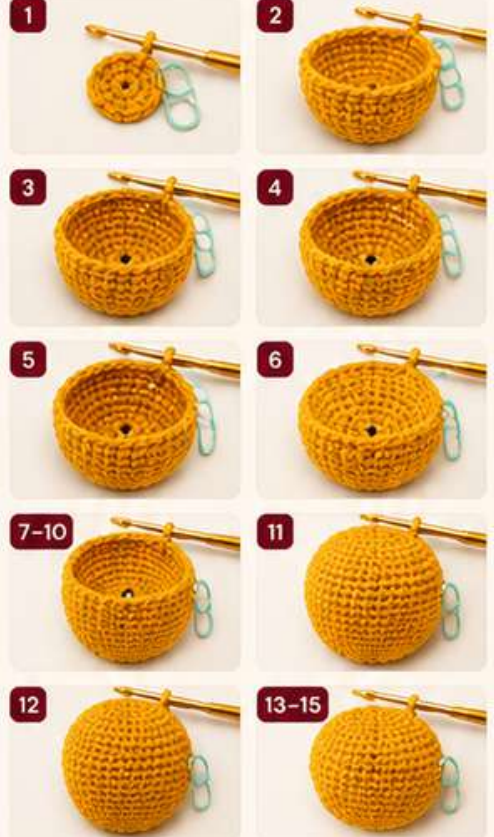

HEAD – PART 1: BASIC HEAD STRUCTURE

ROUND	STITCHES	INSTRUCTIONS	TOTAL STITCHES
1	MR 6 sc	Magic Ring, 6 single crochet into the ring	6
2	6 inc	Increase in each stitch around	12
3	(sc, inc) x 6	Single crochet, increase repeat 6 times	18
4	(2 sc, inc) x 6	2 single crochet, increase repeat 6 times	24
5	(3 sc, inc) x 6	3 single crochet, increase repeat 6 times	30
6	(4 sc, inc) x 6	4 single crochet, increase repeat 6 times	36
7–10	36 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	36
11	(4 sc, dec) x 6	4 single crochet, decrease repeat 6 times	30
12	(3 sc, dec) x 6	3 single crochet, decrease repeat 6 times	24
13	(2 sc, dec) x 6	2 single crochet, decrease repeat 6 times	18
14	(sc, dec) x 6	Single crochet, decrease repeat 6 times	12
15	6 dec	Decrease in each stitch around	6

PROGRESS PHOTOS



SHAPING NOTES

- Rounds 1–6: Build the top and sides of the head.
- Rounds 7–10: Create height and a smooth round shape.
- Rounds 11–15: Start shaping the back of the head.
- Stuff firmly as you work.
- The opening will be used to attach the snout in Part 2.

VISUAL GUIDE (TOP VIEW)



TIPS

- Keep your tension even for a smooth shape.
- Use a stitch marker to keep track of rounds.
- Stuff as you go for a firm head.
- Don't over-stuff; keep it slightly firm.
- We will add the snout and facial details in the next part.

YOU'RE DOING GREAT!



You've completed the basic head structure.
Let's continue to build the snout and face details in Part 2.



HEAD – PART 2

— SNOUT, JAW & FACIAL SHAPING —

In this part, we will shape the snout, lower jaw and cheeks, then add the eyes and finish the facial details.

DETAILS

We will build the snout first, then create the lower jaw. Shaping is done using increases, decreases and proper stuffing. Use a stitch marker to keep track of rounds. Stuff firmly as you go for a clean, defined shape.

YARN COLOR



Mustard Yellow
(Main Color)

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



HEAD – PART 2: SNOUT, JAW & FACIAL SHAPING

ROUND	STITCHES	INSTRUCTIONS	TOTAL STITCHES
16	(2 sc, dec) x 3	2 single crochet, decrease repeat 3 times	9
17	9 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	9
18	(2 sc, inc) x 3	2 single crochet, increase repeat 3 times	12
19	12 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	12
20	(3 sc, inc) x 3	3 single crochet, increase repeat 3 times	15
21	15 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	15
22	(4 sc, inc) x 3	4 single crochet, increase repeat 3 times	18
23	18 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	18
24	(4 sc, dec) x 3	4 single crochet, decrease repeat 3 times	15
25	15 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	15
26	(3 sc, dec) x 3	3 single crochet, decrease repeat 3 times	12
27	(2 sc, dec) x 3	2 single crochet, decrease repeat 3 times	9

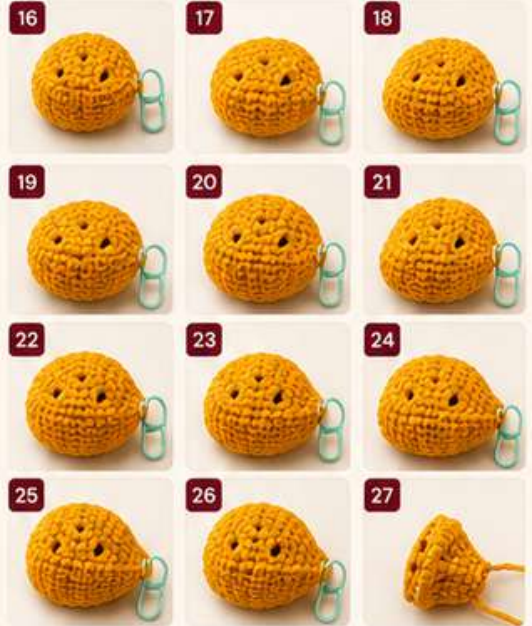
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. This completes the snout.

LOWER JAW (MANDIBLE)

ROUND	STITCHES	INSTRUCTIONS	TOTAL STITCHES
1	MR 6 sc	Magic Ring. 6 single crochet into the ring	6
2	6 inc	Increase in each stitch around	12
3	(sc, inc) x 6	Single crochet, increase repeat 6 times	18
4	18 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	18
5	(7 sc, inc) x 2, 2 sc	7 single crochet, increase repeat 2 times, 2 sc	20
6	20 sc	Single crochet in each stitch around	20

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the lower jaw to the head (Rounds 16–22) as shown in photo guide.

PROGRESS PHOTOS



LOWER JAW (MANDIBLE)



VISUAL GUIDE (ASSEMBLY)



Align the lower jaw to the bottom of the head.

Sew securely using the long tail. Stuff before closing completely.

SHAPING NOTES

- Rounds 16–23: Build the length and width of the snout.
- Rounds 24–27: Taper the tip of the snout.
- Lower jaw adds depth and gives the dragon its expression.
- Adjust stuffing to get the shape you like.

TIPS

- Keep your tension even for a smooth shape.
- Use pins before sewing the jaw in place.
- Stuff the cheeks a bit more for a strong 3D look.
- Check symmetry as you shape both sides.



GREAT JOB!

You have shaped the snout, jaw and facial structure. Next, we will add the eyes, horns and finishing details in Part 3.



EYES, EYEBROWS, NOSTRILS & MOUTH DETAILS

In this part, we will add eyes, shape the eyebrows, create nostrils and define the mouth to bring your dragon's face to life.

DETAILS

These small details create character and expression. Take your time and position everything symmetrically.

Use pins to mark placement before sewing or embroidering. Stuff firmly as you go for a clean, defined look.

YARN COLOR



Mustard Yellow
(Main Color)

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



1 EYES

Use safety eyes or sew the eyes between Rounds 20–21, about 6–7 stitches apart.



Mark placement with pins.



Insert safety eyes from the outside.



Secure with washers on the inside.

Tip: Ensure both eyes are level and evenly spaced.

2 EYEBROWS

Create expressive eyebrows to give your dragon character.



Ch 6.



Starting in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across (5 sc).



Sl st, ch 1, sc in same st, then sl st. Fasten off.



Pin and sew above the eyes.

Tip: Angle the eyebrows slightly downward for a fierce look.

3 NOSTRILS

Nostrils are placed on the snout to add depth and realism.



Mark nostrils between Rounds 8–9, about 6 stitches apart.



Using black yarn, embroider small slanted stitches.



Make 2–3 stitches on each side to form the nostrils.

Tip: Keep stitches small and slightly angled.

4 MOUTH

Define the mouth to give your dragon expression.



Mark mouth corners between Rounds 10–11.



Using black yarn, embroider a gentle smile or closed mouth line.



Adjust the curve to your preferred expression.

Tip: Keep the line slightly curved for a natural look.

VISUAL GUIDE (FRONT VIEW)



PLACEMENT SUMMARY

- **Eyes:** Between Rounds 20–21, 6–7 stitches apart.
- **Eyebrows:** 1–2 rounds above the eyes.
- **Nostrils:** Between Rounds 8–9, about 6 stitches apart.
- **Mouth:** Between Rounds 10–11, from one corner to the other.

TIPS

- Always step back and check symmetry.
- Use pins to preview placement.
- Embroider tightly and neatly.
- Adjust the shape as you go.
- Small details make a big difference!



GREAT JOB!

Your dragon's face is coming to life! Next, we will build the horns and head spikes in Part 3.



HORNS – MAIN HORNS + SMALL HORNS

In this part, we will crochet the main horns and small horns, then show you how to attach them to the head.

DETAILS

We will crochet the main horns (first), then the small horns. Both are stuffed lightly for shape and then attached securely. Use pins to check placement before sewing. Stuff firmly as you go for a clean, defined look.

YARN COLOR



Deep Red
(Accent Color)

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



1 MAIN HORNS (MAKE 2)

These are the large, curved horns on top of the head.

1



Ch 6.

2



Starting in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across (5 sc).

3



Sc in each stitch around.

4



Repeat sc around for 5 more rounds.

5



Start decreasing gradually (to shape the curve).

6



Stuff lightly.

7



Continue decreasing until the tip.

8



Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

9



Make a second horn the same way.

TIP: Keep the curve natural. Do not over-stuff the tips.

2 SMALL HORNS (MAKE 6)

These small horns add detail along the head and brows.

1



Ch 4.

2



Starting in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across (3 sc).

3



Sc in each stitch around.

4



Repeat for 2 more rounds.

5



Start slight decrease at the top.

6



Stuff lightly.

7



Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

8



Make 6 small horns in total.

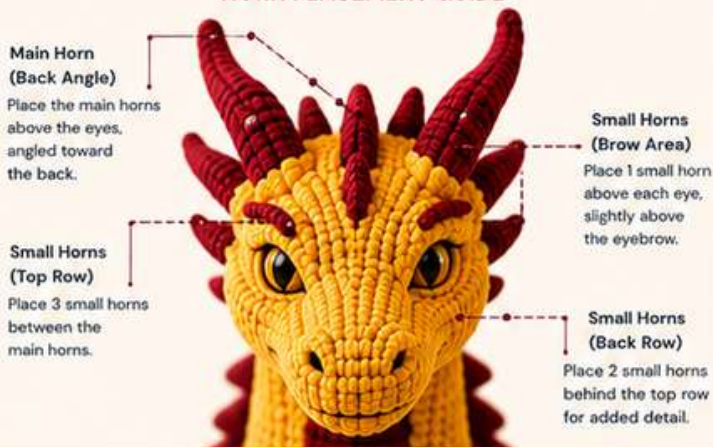
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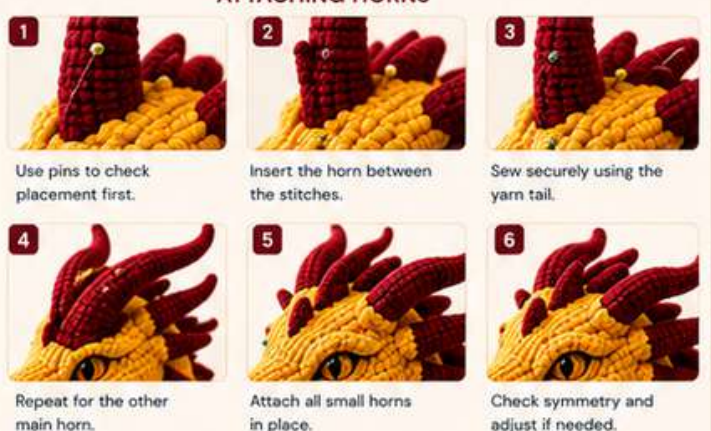
All small horns ready.

TIP: Keep all small horns the same size for a balanced look.

HORN PLACEMENT GUIDE



ATTACHING HORNS



SUMMARY

- **2 Main Horns:** Large, curved, placed above the eyes.
- **6 Small Horns:** Add detail on top, brows, and back.
- Check placement with pins before sewing.
- Keep both sides symmetrical.

TIPS

- ✓ Keep tension consistent.
- ✓ Stuff lightly for a smooth shape.
- ✓ Sew horns firmly so they don't move.
- ✓ Adjust the angle for a fierce look.
- ✓ Step back and check both sides.



WELL DONE!

Your dragon is taking shape beautifully!

Next, we will build the Neck and Spikes.



EARS + BACK-OF-HEAD SPIKES

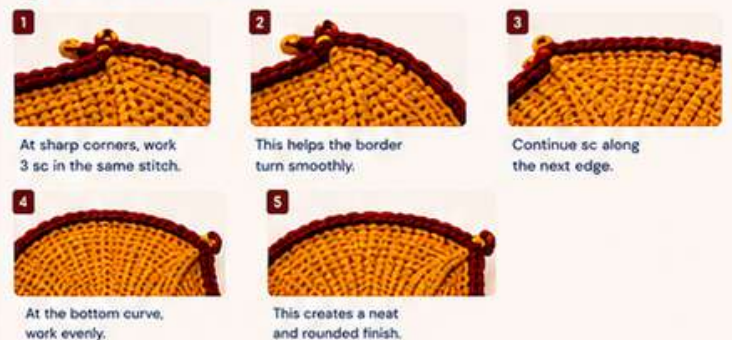


3 ADDING THE DECORATIVE BORDER (OUTER EDGE)



TIP: Work in single crochet for a clean, strong border.

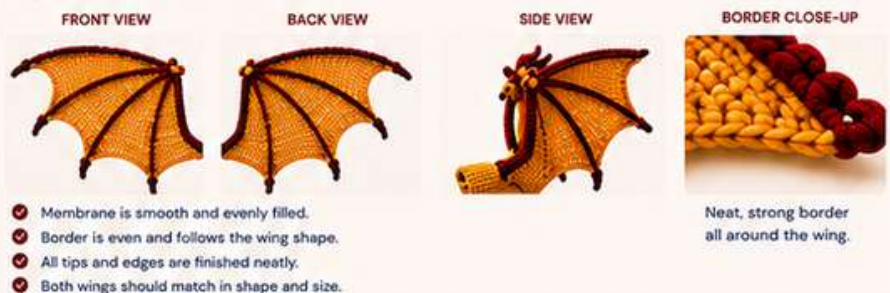

WING MEMBRANE TIPS

- ✓ Use stitch markers to keep track of rounds.
- ✓ Keep tension even for a smooth fabric.
- ✓ Do not pull too tight — allow slight flexibility.
- ✓ Stuff lightly only near the base if needed.

BORDER TIPS

- ✓ Single crochet gives a firm, clean edge.
- ✓ Use 3 sc in one stitch at sharp points.
- ✓ Keep stitches even for a professional finish.
- ✓ Fasten off securely to prevent loosening.

DRAGON BACK SPIKES + ADDITIONAL DETAILS

In this final part, we will crochet the back spikes along the spine and add the small details that bring your dragon to life.

DETAILS

We will crochet each back spike and attach it along the spine from the head down to the tail. Then we'll add the final details to complete your majestic dragon. Use stitch markers to keep track of your rounds. Stuff lightly only where needed for stability.

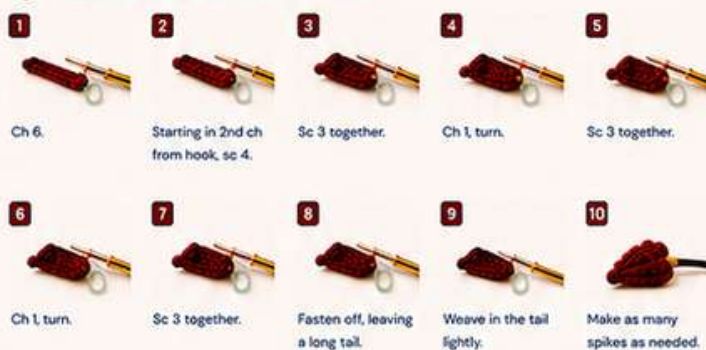

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



1 CROCHETING THE BACK SPIKES



TIP: Make enough spikes to run from the back of the head to the end of the tail.

3 SPIKE SIZE VARIATION



TIP: Adjust the number of stitches in the base chain for bigger or smaller spikes.

5 FINAL DETAILS – CLAWS & TOES



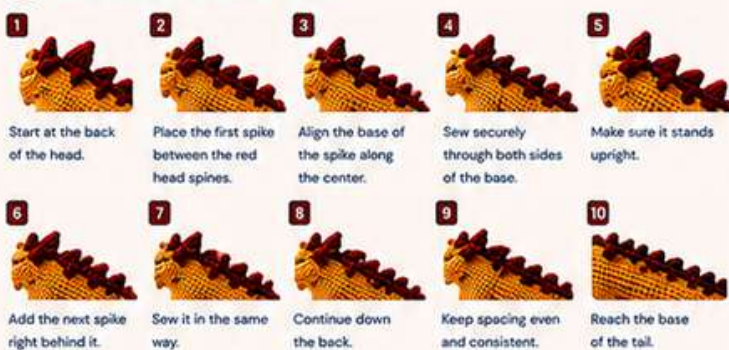
TIP: Use deep red yarn for a strong, consistent claw look.

7 FINAL DETAILS – TAIL & FINISH



TIP: Lightly block your dragon if needed to set the shape.

2 ATTACHING THE BACK SPIKES



TIP: Keep all spikes centered along the spine for a neat, powerful look.

4 FINAL DETAILS – HEAD & FACE



TIP: Use black or dark brown yarn for small details like nostrils and mouth.

6 FINAL DETAILS – WINGS



TIP: Make sure both wings are the same size and shape.

8 FRONT, SIDE & BACK VIEWS



ADDITIONAL TIPS

- ✓ Keep tension even throughout.
- ✓ Use stitch markers for accuracy.
- ✓ Stuff firmly but only where needed.
- ✓ Take your time – details make it perfect!

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Spikes not centered on the spine.
- ✗ Uneven spacing between spikes.
- ✗ Loose stitches on small parts.
- ✗ Forgetting to secure all tails.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- ✓ All crocheted pieces from previous sections
- ✓ Yarn needle
- ✓ Stitch markers
- ✓ Scissors
- ✓ Stuffing

YARN COLORS



Mustard Yellow
(Main Color)



Deep Red
(Accent Color)

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



1 ATTACH THE HEAD TO THE NECK



Align the head with the top of the neck. Use your yarn needle and sew securely around the base. Make sure it is tight and centered.

2 ATTACH THE FRONT LEGS



Position the front legs on each side of the body, just below the neck. Sew them firmly in place.

3 ATTACH THE HIND LEGS



Place the hind legs on the lower body, one on each side. Sew securely and stuff lightly if needed before closing.

4 ATTACH THE TAIL



Align the base of the tail with the back of the body. Sew firmly all around to secure it in place.

5 ATTACH THE WINGS



Position the wings on the upper back, one on each side. Sew along the base of the wing bone to attach securely.

6 ADD THE BACK SPIKES



Starting from the head, align the back spikes along the spine. Sew each spike down the center securely all the way to the tail.

7 ADD THE TAIL SPIKES



Attach the smaller tail spikes from the base to the tip. Make sure they are evenly spaced and secure.

8 EMBROIDER THE FACE DETAILS



Use dark yarn to embroider nostrils, eyelids, and any expression lines. This brings your dragon's face to life!

9 CHECK THE CLAWS & TOES



Ensure all claws and toes are sewn tightly. Adjust spacing if needed for a natural look.

10 FINAL SHAPE & BALANCE



Adjust the legs, tail, head, and wings so your dragon can sit or stand balanced. Make sure it looks strong and proud!

11 STUFF & FIRM UP



Add extra stuffing to the body, neck, and tail if needed. Ensure a firm but smooth shape.

12 FINAL CHECK



Go over all joints and attachments. Reinforce any loose areas. Your dragon is almost ready!

13 YOUR DRAGON IS COMPLETE!



Congratulations! You have completed your majestic crochet dragon!

ASSEMBLY TIPS

- ✓ Use stitch markers to help align parts.
- ✓ Sew tightly so pieces do not move.
- ✓ Stuff gradually for the best shape.

- ✓ Sewing parts too loosely.
- ✓ Uneven spike spacing.
- ✓ Wings placed too low or too high.
- ✓ Not securing the tail well.
- ✓ Skipping facial details.

In this last section, we will shape your dragon, adjust all parts for the best look, add the final touches, and pose your dragon proudly!

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- ✓ Completed dragon
- ✓ Stuffing
- ✓ Yarn needle
- ✓ Stitch markers
- ✓ Scissors

YARN COLORS



Mustard Yellow
(Main Color)



Deep Red
(Accent Color)

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



1 CHECK ALL PARTS



Make sure all pieces are attached securely. Check for any loose stitches or uneven areas.

2 REFINE THE SHAPE



Gently shape the head, snout, and cheeks. Adjust the neck so it holds a natural curve.

3 ADJUST THE LEGS



Position the front and hind legs so your dragon stands firmly and evenly. Make sure it is balanced.

4 SHAPE THE TAIL



Curve the tail into the desired shape. Make sure the tail supports the dragon's balance.

5 SET THE WINGS



Spread the wings to your preferred angle. Adjust the membrane and edges for a natural look.

6 CHECK THE SPIKES



Make sure all back, head, and tail spikes are evenly spaced and stand upright. Adjust if needed.

7 EMBROIDER DETAILS



Add nostrils, eyelids, and any expression lines using dark yarn. This brings your dragon to life!

8 SECURE EVERYTHING



Weave in all loose ends securely. Check that all parts are firmly attached and nothing is loose.

9 FINAL STUFFING CHECK



Feel the body, head, and tail. Add a little more stuffing if needed for a firm, smooth shape.

10 FINAL TOUCH



Give your dragon a final inspection. Adjust the pose, shapes, and details until you are happy with it!

TROUBLESHOOTING

Even the most careful crocheters run into little issues sometimes. Don't worry! Here are solutions to the most common problems to help you perfect your dragon.

DETAILS

Small mistakes can change the shape or balance of your dragon. Use this guide to identify problems early and fix them with confidence. Take your time, stay patient, and enjoy the process!

YARN COLORS



Mustard Yellow
(Main Color)



Deep Red
(Accent Color)

HOOK SIZE

2.5 mm



1 HEAD TILTS FORWARD OR BACKWARD

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Adjust the neck length or add/remove rounds at the base of the neck. Make sure the stuffing is firm and evenly distributed.

2 UNEVEN EYES

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Count the stitches carefully when placing the safety eyes. Use stitch markers to align both eyes at the same level.

3 LEGS ARE UNEVEN

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Make sure both legs have the same number of rounds. Check stuffing and adjust the position before closing.

4 DRAGON DOESN'T STAND FLAT

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Add more stuffing to the belly and legs. Ensure the tail is positioned slightly to the side for better balance.

5 TAIL CURLS TOO MUCH OR TOO LITTLE

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Adjust the wire (if used) or reshape by steaming and pinning. Add or remove rounds to get the desired length and curve.

6 WINGS ARE UNEVEN

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Re-check the wing placement rounds. Count stitches on both sides to make sure they match before attaching.

7 WING MEMBRANE HAS HOLES

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Tighten your stitches slightly. Avoid skipping stitches unless stated in the pattern. Use a smaller hook if needed.

8 BACK SPIKES LOOK UNEVEN

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Ensure each spike has the same number of stitches and is sewn at the same angle along the spine.

9 STUFFING SHOWING THROUGH STITCHES

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Use tighter stitches or a smaller hook size. Add a thin layer of fiberfill inside before closing the part completely.

10 LOOSE PARTS

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Sew all parts securely using yarn needle and matching yarn. Weave in ends well and reinforce high-stress areas.

11 CLAWS/TOES NOT EVEN

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Check the number of stitches for each claw/toe. Make sure they are placed evenly and stuffed firmly.

12 NOSE OR SNOUT LOOKS FLAT

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Add a little extra stuffing to the snout and reshape while sewing. Use small stitches to define the nose shape.

13 DRAGON LOOKS LOPSIDED

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Check all parts for even counts and placement. Adjust stuffing and sewing to balance both sides.

14 COLORS LOOK DULL

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Use good lighting while working and photographing. Blocking (steam) lightly can help the stitches look even and vibrant.

15 FINISHING LOOKS MESSY

PROBLEM



SOLUTION

Weave in all yarn ends neatly. Use matching yarn and hide knots inside the stitches for a clean professional finish.

GENERAL TIPS

- ✓ Use stitch markers to keep track of rounds.
- ✓ Count stitches at the end of each round.
- ✓ Stuff gradually and firmly.
- ✓ Don't rush – patience gives the best results!

STILL STUCK?

It's okay to take a break and come back later. Sometimes a fresh look helps you find the solution. You're doing great!



REMEMBER

Every dragon is unique and beautiful in its own way. Small imperfections make your dragon special and one-of-a-kind!
